CAP FAST FACTS

- 336 miles of canal from Lake Havasu City to Tucson.
- Colorado River allocation of 1,500,000 acre feet of water annually
- Three classifications of users: municipal (e.g., cities such as Phoenix, Tucson and Scottsdale), agricultural districts and Indian communities (12 tribes have allocations).
- The average size of the aqueduct in its beginning is 80 feet across the top and 24 feet across the bottom and the water is 16.5 feet deep.
- 14 re-lift pumping plants & 6 recharge facilities.
- CAP cost \$3.6 billion to construct. According to the contract with the federal government, \$1.65 billion has to be repaid.
- The canal will deliver an average of 1.5 million acre feet of Colorado River water annually. If the canal were operated full-bore year round, the capacity would be approximately 2.2 million acre feet.
